

Get Started on "5S Plus"

YOUR CHECKLIST TO CREATING AN EFFECTIVE VISUAL WORKPLACE

You've made the decision to start your journey to a leaner, safer and more productive workplace. But where do you start? Follow the checklist below to start preparing your facility to reach 5S lean manufacturing standards, plus safety!

SORT		
	Identify 5S project area and review sorting criteria (quantity of items needed, frequency of use, etc.)	
	Create a red tag* area, using floor marking tape as a boundary	
	Have red tags and red tag log forms available	
	Tag, record and move red-tagged items	
	After determined time frame, remove unclaimed items	
ηc	Unused items are identified with red tags, then placed in a red tag area for a designated amount of time. Anything not claimed is then disposed of.	
SHINE		
	Obtain the necessary cleaning supplies and personal protective equipment	
	Establish a definition of "clean"	
	Identify contamination sources and potential safety risks (metal shavings, sharp edges, etc.)	
	Shutdown and lockout equipment to prevent safety risks	
	Clean the work area and fix small imperfections	
SET IN ORDER		
	Share insights gained from Sort and Shine among team members	
	List, discuss and prioritize improvement opportunities (ways to make the workplace more visually instructive, overcome challenges, and reduce waste and errors)	
	Evaluate the current workplace and create a future state workplace diagram	
	Get approval for change from stakeholders	
	Determine plant marking standards	
	Collect plant marking identification and ordering supplies	
	Apply labeling, marking and color-coding (floor marking, equipment and tool identification, inventory marking, tanks, pipes, vales, motors and electrical panel labeling)	

STANDARDIZE	
	Discuss ideas for establishing changes as standard operating procedure
	Update documentation to reflect changes (workplace diagrams, flowcharts, procedures, work instructions, visual aids, etc.)
	Communicate new standards and train all stakeholders
SUSTAIN	
	Monitor processes that have been established and evaluate effectiveness
	Expand efforts to other work areas
	Recognize and reward strong efforts
	Implement sustainability actions (teams benchmark progress and share ideas, present/communicate results, visit other companies to get new ideas, conduct audits, etc.)
	Generate ideas to continuously approve the approach
SAFETY	
	Evaluate the quantity and effectiveness of current safety signage and personal protective equipment
	Obtain the necessary label printer and materials, or pre-made labels, tags and signs, needed to create safety and facility identification visuals
	Create the signage needed to reach compliance (signs and tags aligning with OSHA's GHS, ANSI, HazCom and other standards)
	Continuously improve safety with signage to give employees the information and visuals they need to avoid hazards and stay safe
